Public Safety Members Present: Commissioners Jack Vincent, Kevin McAlpin, Bob Bell, John Salmon, Scott Fortner and Earl Wright.

The Public Safety Committee reconvened on September 17, 2012 at 4:30 p.m. at the Weakley County Courthouse in the county commission courtroom. Others present included Shawn Francisco-Director of Finance, Jamison Peevyhouse, County Mayor Houston Patrick, other county commissioners, & a representative from the Dresden Enterprise.

Chairman Jack Vincent called the meeting the order.

Resolution #2013-09

The resolution adopts a county flood prevention to meet the NFIP regulations found in Title 44 of the Code of Federal Regulations, chapter 1, section 60.3. Commissioner Fortner made the motion to approve Resolution #2013-09 and with a second by Commissioner McAlpin the motion passed. Chairman Vincent stated the committee needed to consider amending the resolution on page 16, Article VI, section A and Article VI, section A3. Commissioner McAlpin made the motion to amend Article VI, Section A changing the word "regional board of zoning appeals" to read "county board of zoning appeals." Commissioner Fortner seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. The committee agreed for the Public Safety committee to accept the responsibility as the county board of zoning appeals. Discussion continued on the resolution. Commissioner Bell made the motion to table the resolution and with a second by Commissioner Salmon, a roll call vote was taken. The motion to table failed with 2-Yes and 4-No votes. Weakley County does not charge any fee to determine whether the property is located in a flood zone. Chairman Vincent made the motion to amend Article VI, Section A, 3 to reflect the fee of \$250 for each appeal to the county board of zoning appeals. Commissioner Fortner seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Commissioner Fortner made the motion to amend Article VI, Section A, 3 to (10) business days for the reasonable time of each hearing. Commissioner McAlpin seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Commissioner Wright made the motion to adjourn and with a second by Commissioner Bell the meeting adjourned at 4:50 p.m.
