

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS
 TO THE GENERAL FUND
 FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1993

WHEREAS, The Weakley County Juvenile Court has applied for and received a Grant through The State of Tennessee, Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth for the purpose of preparing a Truancy Prevention Program and,

WHEREAS, funding for this program has been for the period ending June 30, 1994, and,

WHEREAS, those events having occurred requiring adjustments in the Fiscal Year 1993-1994 Weakley County General Fund Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Weakley County, Tennessee assembled in regular session on this 31st day of February, 1994; that:

OTHER BUSINESS:

The Commission approved the endorsement of a state funded school for firefighters as requested by the State Fire Marshal's office and other agencies. Motion for this was made by Comm. Gene Harris and seconded by Comm. George Broussard. After a voice vote, motion carried.

A Committee to was established to handle problems. The committee includes three (3) members from the Personnel Committee. They are Comm. Oliver, Comm. Carpenter and Comm. Brasfield. Three members from the HEW Committee which are Comm. Bucy, Comm. Van-Cleave, and Comm. Salmon.

Comm. McCreight makes a motion to recess until Feb. 1, 1994 at 9:30 am and seconded by Comm. Bates. Comm. Bates makes an amendment to the motion to have the meeting at 7:00 pm on Feb. 3, 1994. Seconded by Comm. George Broussard. After a voice vote motion, as amended, carried.

On February 3, 1994, the recessed court was called to order. Co. Exec. Kerry Killebrew called the court to order and County Clerk Faye Butts called roll with 19 present and 1 absent, that being Comm. James H. Bell.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT: Comm. McCreight, chairman, reported that the committee met and addressed two items. One was the Health Dept. for the county. The committee authorized the Co. Exec. to enter into such an agreement for the county to receive funds for construction and for purchase of the property. It will be located on Hwy 22, next to the veterinary clinic in the northwest corner. It will not cost the county any money. The second item of business, was the proposal of the school board. It was plan # 5 with 2 High School, West Weakley High School which would consist of Martin and Sharon, and East Weakley High School, which would include Dresden, Gleason, Greenfield and Palmersville. The Westview High School would be the new Martin Jr. High, and the Dresden High School would be the new Dresden Jr. High. This comes with the full approval of the committee and the total cost will be \$18,485,420.00.

STATEMENT FROM COMMISSIONER RONNIE BATES:

I object to this Commission taking any further action on this problem as long as some of the people of the County don't have equal voting rights. If the "one man one vote" rule is a good rule, then we are certainly in violation of a good rule.

I believe that the difference in population between voting districts is so great that the people in some of the Districts are being illegally deprived of their rights.

In the district I represent, the population is 26.4% more than the average District population. There is another District where the population is 23% less than it should be if all the citizens of the County were being given equal voting rights.

I understand that according to the guidelines laid down by the Courts, each voting District should not vary more than 5% from being equal to other Districts. In Weakley County, only 4 of the 10 Districts are within that 5% limit.

There are ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE more people in my District than there are in another District which has the same voting power and membership on this School Board. I believe this is a violation of the law, and I insist that no action be taken by this Commission until the violation is corrected.

I want these statements to be made a part of the official minutes of this meeting, verbatim, so that there can be no doubt at any later time as to what I said or when I said it.

Motion made by Commissioner Charles Culver that the foregoing amendment be approved. Seconded by Commissioner David McAlpin. Upon being put to a roll call vote, motion carried.
