
Judge Thomas talked to the court and read a letter from Harold W. Moore, Sr. relative to the leaking and damage in the Court House. Then he presented the following resolution:

WHEREAS, our Court House is leaking badly through the stones around the top of the building, and

WHEREAS, ~~Harold W. Moore~~ such leakage is causing much damage both to the inside and the outside of the building and

WHEREAS, Harold W. Moore, a stone contractor of Nashville was recommended by the Architect of this building as one of the most capable firms for this type of repair, and

WHEREAS, Mr. Moore had made an estimate of the situation and has agreed to do all the work necessary to stop the leakage, which work is described in detail in the attached letter, for \$4,571.75, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Judge is hereby authorized to contract with the said Harold W. Moore to do the work described in the attached letter, said contract price is not to exceed the agreed price of \$4,571.75.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE 1957-1958 budget is to be increased by this amount, or \$4,571.75.

Motion made by Esq. U. M. Fuller to accept and approve the above stated resolution, seconded by Esq. Horace McWherter.

It was agreed that this would be included in the Roll call vote on the Appropriation Budget.
