BE IT REMEMBERED, that on January 5, 1959, it being the First Monday in January, 1959, the Weakley County Quarterly Court met in regular session in the County Courtroom of the Court House, in Dresden, Weakley County, Tennessee, with the Honorable Cayce Pentecost, County Judge, presiding, with All Vowell, Deputy Sheriff, present, and Ellis E. Featherstone, Clerk of the County Court also present. Said Court meeting was called to order by Judge Pentecost and opened for the session by Deputy Sheriff, All Vowell. THEREUPON, a quorum being declared present, the following proceedings were had, to-wit: The Court was opened by the singing of three songs and prayer by Clerk Featherstone. There were some remarks made by Judge Pentecost, the main ones being that the largest expenditure of the county funds was toward the schools of the County and the next largest expenditure was for roads. He expressed his concern with reference to the gravelling of the rural roads of the County, and the fact that there are many rural roads not gravelled and he would like to see this done for the rural people; that there was a 10% gravel tax the County was receiving and that maybe something could be worked out to use some of this tax.
