He offered his heartfelt thanks for all courtesies shown to him during these years. He was presented a suit of clothes and a hat by the office holders of the Court house and the Quarterly Court.

Having met with the approval of the Finance Committee and the present custodians, motion was made by Esq. Jack Jolley that the pay of Cleatus Kelly be raised to \$200.00 per month and the pay of Morton Rawls be raised to \$170.00 and not have to hire another person full time with the exception of window washing time when some extra help might be had to be paid by the County, thereby still saving the County money, seconded by Esq. M. A. Miles. Unanimously approved.
