

The following resolution was read to the Court, which Resolution is in the following words and figures, to-wit:

"WHEREAS, there has been much confusion regarding beer permits where the licensee has ceased to operate a retail beer establishment for various periods of time, and,

WHEREAS, there are differences of opinion among our legal profession as to the effect of an operator voluntarily, or otherwise, ceasing to operate on his permit,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Weakley County Quarterly Court that the permit of any beer retailer in Weakley County is automatically revoked if the retailer voluntarily, or otherwise, ceases to sell beer for a period of sixty (60) days or more, without express permission from the Weakley County Beer Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be spread upon the Minutes of the Weakley County Quarterly Court and a copy be mailed to each beer retailer in Weakley County."
