

REPAIRING STREET BY NATIONAL GUARD AMORY AND LIVESTOCK PAVILLION

Grooma Herron, City Attorney for the City of Dresden came before the court asking that the Court chip and oil the road between the National Guard Amory and Weakley County Livestock Pavillion. Mr. Dinmiddle, County Road Supervisor, said they could do the work if the material were furnished. The City proposes that they have furnished their share by graveling and the County should keep it up as it is not a revenue paying property and is used by the County People. Esq Jack Jolley gave his opinion as the road being one that isn't used much and that a graveled road is good enough for the purpose in which it serves. The estimate cost of the project is in the amount of \$1,000.00.

Motion was made by Esq. Charles Castellow and seconded by Robert Glasgow that this matter be deferred to a later term of Court. Upon being put to a vote, same carried unanimous voice vote of the Court.

PUBLIC ROAD

Attorney Grooms Herron came before the Court at the request of an attorney representing Mr. Wright and Leonard Bynum concerning a claim for property damages in the building of a public road. Mr. Herron explained the matter as one in which Mr. Wright's wife did not enter into the agreement for the road to be built therefore they are entitled to the damages. At the request of the County Judge E. W. Wheeling this matter was referred to the County Attorney Harold T. Brundige.

MOTORCYCLE ORDINANCE

Esq. George T. Stover came before the Court asking if something could be done to stop the teenagers from riding two and three persons on a motorcycle, without any protection on their body, such as a helmet on all persons riding, and without drivers licenses and licenses for the vehicle. This matter was referred to Harold T. Brundige, County Attorney. He suggested that to get this done you would have to go through the legislature. Then the law would have to be ratified by the Court after passed in the legislature. The Judge and County Attorney agreed to get an ordinance passed concerning this matter.

Motion was made by Esq. Winton Scarbrough and seconded by Dalton Glover that the foregoing matter be approved by the Court. Upon being put to a vote, same carried by unanimous voice vote of the Court.

REDISTRICT --WEAKLEY COUNTY QUARTERLY COURT

Esq. Charles A. Roberts submitted to the Weakley County Quarterly Court a petition signed by Fred Rucker, W. J. Anderson, John O. Alexander, Jr. and Charles A. Robert, all citizens of Weakley County. The signed petition, petitioning the Weakley County Quarterly Court to request the 1967 Tennessee General Assembly to redistrict the Weakley County Quarterly Court and other Boards and Commissions heading the various other Government Units of Weakley County.

At the conclusion of reading this petition Esq. Charles A. Roberts moved that the County Judge appoint a committee to take this matter under advisement, to study it, and to report to a special session of the County Court on Feb. 6, 1967 for the purpose of considering a plan to be proposed for adoption by the present Legislature, this motion was seconded by Esq. Viron Beard.

During the discussion, statements were made by Esq. Roberts, Esq. Beard and Esq. White in explaining purpose of redistricting and voicing their approval and Esq. Hornbeak, Esq. Grooms, and Esq. McClain made statements in opposition to the move. Esq. D. Z. Grooms made a motion to table the motion made by Charles A. Roberts this table motion was seconded by Esq. M. R. Duke. A roll call vote was taken on the table motion which revealed forty-five (45) for and five (5) against.

A Motion was made by/Paul J. Rushing and seconded by Esq. W. S. Buckley and carried by ~~hand~~ vote for the County Court Clerk to notify Weakley County Representatives in the present state legislature to the results of this action.

There being no further business, Court was adjourned by Judge E. W. Wheeling until the first Monday in April, 1967.
