

RESOLUTION REQUESTING MINIMUM COMPENSATION
PAID ELECTION OFFICIALS FOR SERVICES ON
ELECTION DAY BE INCREASED

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 2-4-109 requires that election officials be paid a minimum of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for their services on election day; and

WHEREAS, TCA, Section 2-4-109 also states that the compensation may be increased by resolution of the county legislative body; and,

WHEREAS, the compensation paid election officials for their services on election day has not been increased since April of 1972; and,

WHEREAS, the polling precincts are open for ten continuous hours, each election official serves eleven to twelve hours on election day. The election officials in Weakley County are highly qualified individuals, dedicated to the election process. With these individuals lie the responsibility of carrying out the election laws. Without these officials, elections could not be held; and

WHEREAS, the Weakley County Election Commission recommends and request that election officials be compensated more justly for their services on election day; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Weakley County Legislative Body in its regular meeting this the 30 day of April, 1987, that the minimum compensation paid to election officials be increased to thirty dollars (\$30.00) for the officer and twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for all other officials for their services on election day.
