

WEAKLEY COUNTY LEGISLATIVE BODY
REGULAR MEETING APRIL 20, 1992

The regular meeting of the county commission was called to order by Co. Exec. Kerry Killebrew and invocation was led by Comm. Lewis Garner. After a pledge to flag by all present, Sheriff Mike Wilson opened court and County Clerk, Faye Butts, called roll with all present. Motion approval of minutes of the meeting of January 20, 1992 was made by Comm. Vernon Dunn and seconded by Comm. V. J. Shanklin. After a voice vote, motion carried.

TRUSTEE REPORT: Motion to accept the trustee report was made by Comm John Bucy and seconded by Comm. J. T. Walker. After a voice vote, motion carried.

GENERAL FUND REPORT: Motion to accept the General Fund report was made by Comm. James H. Bell and seconded by Comm. Jerry Carpenter. After a voice vote, motion carried.

HIGHWAY DEPT. REPORT: Motion to accept the Highway Dept report was made by Comm. Earl Wright and seconded by Comm. James H. Bell. After a voice vote, motion carried.

SCHOOL DEPT. REPORT: Motion to accept the School Dept Report was made by Comm. Vernon Dunn and seconded by Comm. Ronnie Bates. After a voice vote, motion carried.

NURSING HOME REPORT: Motion to accept the Nursing Home Report was made by Comm. J. T. Walker and seconded by Comm. Lewis Garner. After a voice vote, motion carried.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT: Comm. Wayne McCreight reported that the committee met three (3) times since the last meeting. We took the the 2 school plan as presented by the School Board and received a motion which was passed by the School Board unanimously 10-0 to persue funding the Martin Elemantary and Martin Primary additions. We accepted the motion into committee. We have instructed the School Board to begin negotiations with an arechitect to see what the cost figures will be to persue the building of a new facitlity at Martin Elemantary and addition to Martin Primary. They will be getting back to us in a short period of time to inform us of what the cost figures will be to entertain that type of project involved with an architect at what time we will bring to the County Commission. Additionally, we received request from the School Board to return the 2 school plan back to them(School Board). We did vote to return it to them and instructed them, as far as the commission was concerned, that we expected the School Board to address the resolution, July 1991, which addresses the proper use of facilities and curriculum for the students of Weakley County and requested they get back to the Property Committee no later than sim(6) months with additional plans concerning this resolution. Third Item: A request for an independent study by the School Board to address the July 1991 resolution they presented to us and we ask them to continue to explore the independant study as they explore the architect situation and get back to us with this when they bring back the information of the architect. Comm. Charles Culver made the motion to accept this report and Comm. John Bucy seconded it. After a voice vote, motion carried.

AMBULANCE COMMITTEE REPORT: Comm. Earl Wright reported that the ambulance business has really picked up, but the staff is managing. The extra ambulance has really help. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. George Broussard and seconded by Comm. V. J. Shanklin. After a voice vote, motion carried.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPROT: Comm. Vernon Dunn said they have had an audit exit and Mr. Tidwell is doing a fine job. The inventory is going fine and everything is doing exceptionally well. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. V. J. Shanklin and seconded by Comm. Wayne McCreight. After a voice vote, motion carried.

HEW COMMITTEE REPORT: Later on the agenda we have a resolution to approve a Private Act for a building permit for a structure over \$5000.00. This will continue to finance the addressing and mapping for E911. The fee will be \$25.00. Comm. John Salmon reports of a resolution to construct a Veterns memorial on the grounds of the Courthouse. It will have the names of the peoples killed in the last four wars plus reconigation of all the other veterans that have served. There are 2900 vets in the county and 122 that have been killed in service. This resolution does ask for \$1500 from the county to start the project. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. John Bucy and seconded by Comm. Jerry Carpenter. After a voice vote, motion carried.
