

RESOLUTION NO. 1974-2B:

WHEREAS, local government is today faced with an ever increasing demand to provide new and expanded services to its citizens, and

WHEREAS, local government has a limited means of increasing its own revenues because of various state and federal policies and regulations, and

WHEREAS, inflation has had the same effect on local government, and in many instances a more dramatic effect, than is felt by the average citizen,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Weakley County Court assembled in regular business session this 14<sup>th</sup> day of October, 1974, that we do hereby petition the members of the Tennessee delegation to the U. S. Senate and House of Representatives to work diligently to secure the extension of the federal revenue sharing act and to increase its funding no less than an amount sufficient to keep pace with inflation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be spread on the minutes of this court and a copy be sent to each of the U. S. Senators and Representatives of the State of Tennessee.

Motion was made by Squire Joe W. White that the foregoing Resolution be approved, Seconded by Squire Johnny Tharp. Upon being put to a voice vote,
