

RESOLUTION NO. 2001-41

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING COUNTY HIGHWAY
DEPARTMENT TO PERFORM WORK FOR
CITY OF GLEASON

WHEREAS, Section 54-7-202 (d) Tennessee Code Annotated, provides that the County Commission can authorize the Highway Department to perform work for other governmental entities; and

WHEREAS, the statute further provides for the Highway Department to be reimbursed for the cost of such projects; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gleason is interested in contracting with the Highway Department to do certain projects within the corporate limits of Gleason; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gleason has agreed to reimburse the county Highway Department for all materials, labor and use of equipment.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the county legislative body of Weakley County, Tennessee assembled in regular session on this the 26th day of March, 2001 in Dresden, Tennessee that the Weakley County Highway Department is authorized to enter into an agreement with the City of Gleason to perform work in the city provided the County is reimbursed for all materials, labor and equipment as provided in Section 54-7-202(d), T.C.A.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all resolutions of the Board of County Commissioners of Weakley County, Tennessee, which are in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.


